The examination commission may include representatives of employers and their associations, in accordance with the provisions of the Examination Commission, approved by the Academic Council of Borys Grinchenko Kyiv University. The term of the certification is defined by the curriculum and the schedule of the educational process.

The final certification of graduates from the specialty "Physical Culture and Sports" happens after the students fully complete the curriculum. The certification has the form of defense of qualifying master's paper on theoretical, methodological and pedagogical aspects of physical education and sport. The certification is open and public.

Successful graduates get a standard document of a Master's Degree with a major in Physical Culture and Sports.
