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## RATIONALE

Changes to the educational-professional program 293.00.01 "International Law", approved by the decision of the Academic Council of Borys Grinchenko Kyiv University from 22.08.2018, protocol № 2 (order № \_\_\_\_ from \_\_\_\_\_ 2018), due to the need to improve its content based on a new trajectory for the creation of a sectoral qualifications system, which is defined by the provisions of the Project for the Development of Legal Education, prepared by the Ministry of Science and Education of Ukraine, new programs for EDC, EFVV and EMI.

During the implementation of the original version of the educational and professional program 293.00.01 "International Law" (2018 - 2019 academic year, 2019 - 2020 academic year, 2020 - 2021 academic year), based on the proposals of scientific and pedagogical staff of the Chair of International Relations and International Law, students, heads of practice bases, potential employers, there was a need to optimize the structural and logical scheme, time norms, set of disciplines and practical training of applicants for the first (bachelor's) level of higher education.

Based on the above, in the educational and professional program 293.00.01 "International Law", approved by the decision of the Academic Council of Borys Grinchenko Kyiv University from 22.08.2018, changes have been made to the following sections:

- general information about the educational and professional program;
- supplementation of disciplines of practical legal direction;
- list of graduate competencies;
- program learning outcomes.

These changes led to the development of a new version of the description of the educational and professional program.

### III. Form of certification of applicants for higher education

Certification of applicants for the educational program 293 "International Law" of the first (bachelor's) level of higher education is carried out in the form of: 1) public defense of bachelor's work; 2) a comprehensive exam in the first foreign language.

Certification ends with the issuance of a standard document on the award of a person who has successfully completed the educational program of bachelor's degree with the award of their qualification: Bachelor of International Law.

Certification of bachelor's degree of students is carried out by an attestation qualification commission, which includes representatives of employers and their associations

Requirements for qualification work	Qualifying bachelor's work is allowed to be defended before the attestation qualification commission, provided that the level of its uniqueness (originality) meets the standard officially approved by the Borys Grinchenko Kyiv University. For publication, public acquaintance with the content of the qualifying bachelor's thesis and prevention of academic plagiarism, it should be posted on the Web-resources of the University or the relevant structural unit, or in the institutional repository.
Requirements for public thesis defence	The defense of the bachelor's thesis takes place at an open meeting of the Examination Commission (EC), which can be attended, ask questions and discuss the bachelor's thesis of all present, with the participation of at least half of the EC and the mandatory presence of the commission chairman. Students who have met all the requirements of the curriculum are allowed to defend their bachelor's theses. Assessment is carried out on a 100-point and national scales and the ECTS scale in accordance with the rating system. In assessing the bachelor's thesis takes into account: the scientific level of work, the degree of coverage of issues that were the subject of research, the importance of work for legal practice, use of special literature, regulations, scientific validity of conclusions, language and style,

	practical relevance of recommendations, skills to conduct a public discussion, to defend their concept and conclusions with arguments.
Requirements for a comprehensive exam in the first foreign language	<p>The comprehensive exam in the first foreign language is aimed at checking the achievement of learning outcomes defined by the educational program.</p> <p>The structure of the comprehensive exam involves checking the achievement of learning outcomes (RN - 1, RN - 19, RN - 21) on professional interpretation and translation from / into the first foreign language, in particular, on professional topics of international cooperation, foreign policy, international law, international private law, European law.</p>

Certification is carried out openly and publicly.

Implementation of the educational program in full ends with the issuance of a document of the established standard to the graduate.
