The Program is a regulatory document of Borys Grinchenko Kyiv University which states the content, size, academic volume and requirements to the professional training of graduates.

It is designed on the basis of The Act on Higher Education of Ukraine, as of 06.11.2015, № 1151 “On Introducing the Branch and Specialty Catalogue for Higher Education”; on the basis of the Higher Education Standard for Branch of knowledge 05 Social and Behavioral Sciences, specialty 052 Politology.

<i>Education and teaching</i>	<p>Organization of educational process is carried out with the principles aimed at implementing student-centered learning in the following forms: sessions (lecture, seminars, practical, individual classes, consultations), individual work, practical training, controlling activities that can take place in public, political and municipal institutions of Kyiv (public centers, organizations, academic institutions, research institutes of different types, etc.).</p> <p>The preference is given to active forms of classroom experience (training techniques, business role-plays, round tables, heuristic and other forms of discussions, etc.), developing students' thinking skills in professional communication. Classes are based on dialogue and partnership interaction. Students attend Centers of Competences, where they deepen practical component of vocational training.</p> <p>Students of II-III years create course projects. Practice for students of Year IV consolidates knowledge and skills gained by the students as a result of mastering theoretical courses, develops practical skills and prompts complex formation of general cultural (universal) and professional competencies of students in political science training. During the final year of study, considerable attention is paid to writing bachelor's papers and doing their research.</p>
<i>Assessment</i>	<p>Assessment of students' academic results is determined by identifying their level and extent of knowledge, skills and other competencies in accordance with the requirements of higher education standards.</p> <p>General assessment of student's knowledge in political subjects is provided through oral reviews, testing their understanding or skills, their analysis of documents or data, reports on practice, etc.</p> <p>Final assessment forms include interim and final procedures. Intermediate control is carried out at the end of each module, which determines what students are expected to gain within a specific topic.</p> <p>The final control is a semester control, which is carried out in the form of a credit or exam to evaluate the results of training at the final</p>

	stage and / or at individual stages of each subject of the curriculum. Elective subjects are evaluated in the form of a credit if these subjects do not provide the student with a minor.

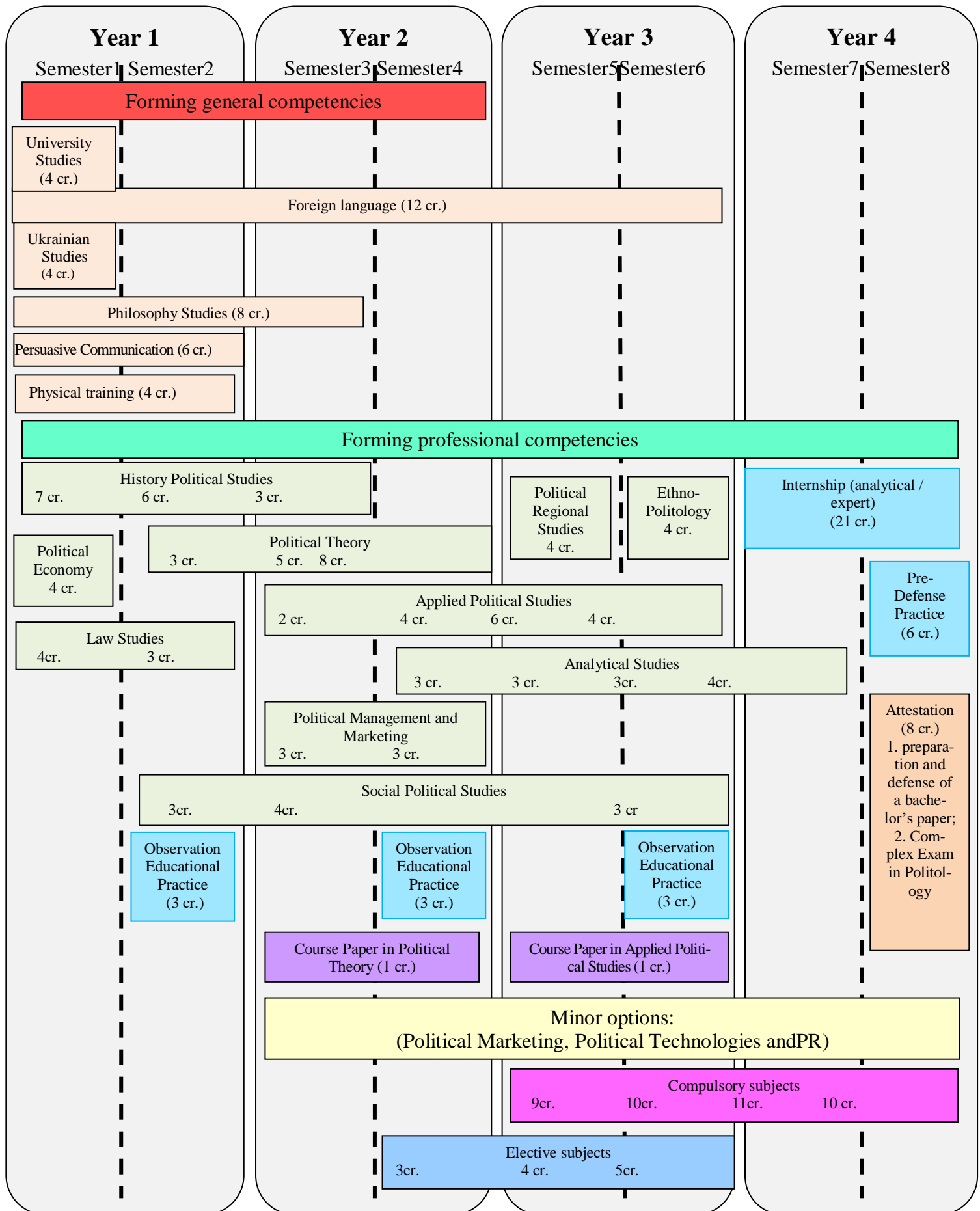

Program graduates' final attestation for 052 «Politology» is conducted as the complex examination in Politology as a viva/written or mixed procedure, as stated by the Department, also as the defense of a bachelor paper. Graduated receive a standard certificate of bachelor degree majoring in Politology.

Attestation procedure is open and public. The papers are to be published through the university site by the Department of Philosophy in the university repository.

Requirements for the internal quality assurance system of higher education in the University

Borys Grinchenko Kyiv University has a system of internal quality assurance of higher education of the University (further - System of Quality), which is an interconnected and interdependent complex of content, forms, methods, technologies and means of training, intermediate and final evaluation of the quality of a future specialist professional training, as well as organizational and pedagogical conditions for its implementation.

This system is designed to support professionally ordered actions of the subjects of educational process in teaching and research space of the University with active use of ICT. It includes the following main subsystems: administrative, professional-pedagogical, technological, criteria-productive. They ensure corporate management of the quality of higher education, its conformity with the established requirements and fixed by regulative-legal documents. It provides the responsibility of authorized persons for the quality of education; contents of procedures and resources available at the University and aimed at ensuring the high quality of educational services; criteria and results of the assessment of the quality of education.

System of Quality is based on internal quality assurance of higher education of the University and includes specifics of training specialists of different directions and specialties. The ultimate goal of the System of Quality functioning is to ensure training of a competitive alumni on the labor market.

The main principle of the Quality System functioning is the student-centeredness of all components of the educational process in the University. The main principles of the System of Quality are:

- openness of all processes related to the providing educational services;
- relevance of the content, forms, methods and technologies of teaching students and postgraduates;
- variability and flexibility in the implementation of educational programs;
- objectivity of assessments and judgments; constant reflection;
- Practical orientation of educational process and its compliance with the needs of labor market.

The internal quality assurance system is implemented through the following measures:

- monitoring of the quality of educational process;
- psychological and pedagogical support of adaptation periods;
- constant updating and improvement of teaching and methodological support;
- development and introduction of new educational programs into practice, improvement and updating of curricula;
- making necessary changes to the content of training specialists;
- introduction of innovative technologies and approaches;

- continuing professional development of pedagogical and scientific -pedagogical staff;
- ensuring publicity of information about educational programs, degrees of higher education and qualifications;
- ensuring the academic integrity of the university staff and applicants for higher education, including the establishment and maintenance of the effective system for preventing and detecting academic plagiarism;
- conducting an external audit on quality management is carried out by independent institutions providing assessment of higher education quality.

In order to monitor the quality of education, the University provides the following procedures:

- self-analysis of specialists` training in accordance with regulatory legal acts and documents, licensing and accreditation requirements, etc.;
- periodic (at least twice a year) analysis of learning progress (according to the courses, specialties, structural units) and the quality of students' knowledge; this analysis of progress is also made for scholarship support;
- a questionnaire for students "Teacher by students` view" while electing for positions or running for the assignment of academic degrees;
- students survey on the formation of their specific competences;
- survey and questionnaire of employers on the quality of training specialists - graduates of the University;
- attracting employers to work in the Examining Committees.

The University provides students with psychological - educational support for adaptation periods (trainings of effective communication, individual work, tutoring, etc.). Continuous updating and improvement of teaching and methodological support is realized through:

- annual updating of current educational programs of disciplines with their mandatory discussion at the meetings of the Department, indicating the resources available in the library's funds (basic literature, professional periodicals, electronic, multimedia resources, etc.);
- updating and developing new means of educational achievements evaluation (in particular, means of intermediate and final control, attestation) to determine the results of training and program learning outcomes;
- compulsory provision of educational disciplines with electronic training courses.

The system of professional development of pedagogical and scientific-pedagogical staff is an integral part of the System of Quality in the University and is regulated by separate provisions. One of the important factors of the System of Quality is the introduction of a corporate standard that regulates team relations, both between employees and between students. The Standard, developed on the basis of leadership-service, is an integral part of social life in the University. All participants of the process must follow the Code of Corporate Culture of the University.
